LPC members requested language shifting in this version of the vision.  Consultant team then introduced the Goals discussion. DOS guidance requires Goals to be realistic, clear and well-defined, and aligned with and supportive of the community's vision.  GOALS:  All-Season Destination: Build on Cape Vincent's reputation as a first-class destination for recreation, cultural events, and the arts.  Welcoming Gateways: Bolster a sense of place in Cape Vincent by enhancing entry points to the community.  Quality of Life: Expand the range of services and amenities available to current and prospective Cape Vincent community members.
